of the temple, the Hindu God Shiva.

The temple is situated atop Konesar Malai, a promontory from where overlooking of large body of Indian ocean, nearby eastern coast, as well as Gokarna bay. Konesvaram is revered as one the Pancha Ishwarams (five abodes) of Sri Lanka for long time. Being a major place for Hindu pilgrimage, it was labelled "Rome of the Gentiles/Pagans of the Orient" in some records. Koneswaram gains its name from the main deity

Pigeon Island National Park



Pigeon Island National Park is one of the two marine national parks of Sri Lanka. The national park is situated 1 km off the coast of Nilaveli, a coastal town in Eastern Province, encompassing a total area of 471.429 hectares. The island's name derives from the rock pigeon which has colonized it. The national park contains some of the best remaining coral reefs of Sri Lanka.

Trincomalee Natural Harbor



Trincomalee Harbour is a seaport in
Trincomalee Bay or Koddiyar Bay, a large
natural harbour situated on the northeastern
coast of Sri Lanka. Located by Trincomalee, Sri
Lanka, in the heart of the Indian Ocean, its
strategic importance has shaped its history.
There have been many sea battles to control
the harbour

Fort Fedrick



Fort Fredrick, also known as Trincomalee Fort or Fort of Triquillimale, is a fort built by the Portuguese at Trincomalee, Eastern Province, Sri Lanka, completed in 1624 CE, built on Swami Rock-Konamamalai from the debris of the world-famous ancient Hindu Koneswaram temple.

Electricity

For Sri Lanka there are two associated plug types, types D and G. Plug type D is the plug which has three round pins in a triangular patterned plug type G is the plug which has three rectangular pins in a triangular pattern. Sri Lanka operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.We recommend you to bring a universal electricity adaptor.
